What is the Kenneth R. Rearwin Scholarship?

Kenneth R. Rearwin, a 1931 graduate of Salina High School, established a trust fund from which presently scholarships are awarded each year to recipients from Salina's Central and South high schools. The scholarship program was instituted to help support programs of study at a university, junior college or technical/vocational school within the state of Kansas.

Mr. Rearwin was concerned that a close friend of his could not attend the college of their choice without the financial assistance of a scholarship. It was his desire that the scholarships be awarded annually to Salina High School graduates as an additional source of funding for their higher education.

Who is eligible to receive the scholarship?

Many of society's solid citizens were once students who didn't qualify academically for the most prestigious scholarships and grants. Therefore, it was Mr. Rearwin's preference to help students with approximately a "B" average GPA span 3.0-3.69 who have good moral character and have been actively involved in school and community activities.

The Kenneth R. Rearwin Scholarship Committee currently awards scholarships annually to one or more graduating seniors of the two Salina high schools. The grants require plans for **full-time** attendance and are made by the Committee on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis.

How are the funds dispersed?

Each scholarship winner advises the Scholarship Committee of the name of the post-secondary school that he or she will attend. The Committee then forwards the grants to each respective school to be dispersed for the benefit of the scholarship recipient (one-year scholarship).

How do I apply?

For application forms and additional information, please contact your school counselor or principal's office. Completed applications, including three references (two from teachers one from other - see reference form), must be received by your school's counseling office no later than the date specified yearly. Recipients will be notified by the trustees immediately following the selection process and are expected to attend their respective honor nights to receive recognition.
